El Grito Inc. is a non-profit, consisting of Head Start, New Mexico State Early PreK, and Early Head Start Center Based/Home Based and Community Childcare programs. Classrooms span all of Grant County and both school districts. A Board of Directors, which is made up of ten members representing the community at large, and a Policy Council whose members must represent at least fifty-one percent of parents having children enrolled in the program govern the program.

El Grito Inc. is monitored every five years by the Office of Head Start/Administration for Children and Families. In the 2019-2020 school year, El Grito Head Start began a five-year monitoring cycle. Also, New Early Childhood Education and Care Department Licensing Bureau monitors the program's sites before the renewal of licenses. Site licenses and monitoring reports are posted at each site and the Federal Monitoring report is available at the Main Center, 303 S. Cooper, Silver City, New Mexico.

Parent Engagement Activities

The parents' engagement in El Grito programs and activities is essential for the program to be successful.

Parents are encouraged to volunteer in the classroom to assist teachers in classroom activities. Parents also contribute to their child's individual curriculum needs.

Parents participate in the decision-making process by participating in program committees i.e. budget, program and policy development ,hiring and curriculum.

All parents are encouraged to become members of the Policy Council. The Policy Council must approve all program additions and revisions, the grant application and budget, and the hiring and termination of employees. The Policy Council President is also a voting member of the Board of Directors.

Student Preparation for Kindergarten

El Grito Head Start strives to prepare its students for kindergarten by ensuring the student's academic, physical, social and emotional, and health needs are addressed. To accomplish this, the program provides visual, auditory. and dental screening. As a result of the screening process, students who may be having difficulties are referred to the appropriate health providers for further evaluation. Parents are required to provide the program with up-to-date immunization, and physical examination records. Also in addressing the student's social and emotional issues, the program has two licensed counselors who work with the staff, children, and their families. El Grito Head Start also prepares the students academically through the daily implementation of the *Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework which includes the following*

- Central Domains:
 - Approaches to Learning
 - Social and Emotional Development
 - Language and Literacy: Language and Communication/Literacy
 - Cognition: Mathematics Development/Scientific Reasoning
 - Perceptual, Motor, and Physical Development

As per the Head Start Act of 2007, El Grito Head Start has developed and implemented a School Readiness Plan which address the *Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework*. The plan is available for interested parties by calling the Associate Director of Education at 575-538-5459.

PROGRAM REVIEWS/LICENSING

El Grito Inc. is monitored and licensed by the state's ECECD (Early Childhood Education and Care) Licensing Bureau. ECECD monitoring is based on the State Child Care Licensing Regulations. Current program licenses are posted at all program centers. In addition, the Office of Head Start, Washington D. C., reviews Head Start programs every three years. The last review was conducted on February 28, 2023. Non-compliance findings found were teacher in center based EHS programs were not meeting the minimum qualifications. Corrective Action plan completed October of 2023. Plan/Actions on file for review at Main Center.

The ECECD Licensing Bureau's current survey reports and Licen<mark>ses are posted</mark> at each site and classrooms. 4 Sites-Two Star.

Food Services Program

The most recent was on March 07, 2023, the New Mexico Children, Youth and Families Department – Early Childhood Services/Family Nutrition Bureau conducted an Administrative Review of El Grito Head Start's food service program. The review included the following federal regulations:

- INSTITUTIONAL RECORD KEEPING
- ENROLLMENT/INCOME ELIGIBILITY
- MEAL SERVICE AND NUTRITION EDUCATION
- VALIDATION OF NON-PROFIT STATUS
- TRAINING AND MONITORING
- SAFETY AND SANITARY PROCEDURES
- INSTUTION'S AUDIT

There were finding of inaccurate meal count for December of 2022. Reimbursement was made and policies/training were implemented. These are on file in Main Center for review.

Program Internal Audit

Clifford, Ross and Cooper, LLC, Certified Public Accountants conducted an audit of El Grito Head Start on December 6, 2023 for the period June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023. There were no findings requiring resolution as a result of the audit. The Federal Audit Clearinghouse indicated that based on their initial review, the audit met federal audit requirements.
